We are commissioning Tim Trussler today for his volunteer service as the Dean of Men at the Royal Family KIDS (RFK) camp June 17-21. RFK believes in creating positive, life-changing moments for innocent foster children who have been victims of neglect, abuse, and abandonment. To that end, RFK conducted 243 camps worldwide last year, with 15,000 volunteers donating 2.5 million hours to serve over 10,000 kids. The primary purpose of Royal Family KIDS camps is to give foster children a week of positive memories and royal treatment in a Christian camp environment.
